

A NOTE FROM OUR CEO

2023 was a banner year for Hope Community Services. It marks our first full year as a Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic. We were able to leverage our focus on whole person care to innovate with Community partners and really meet clients' needs at the epicenter of the mental health and substance use crisis in Oklahoma City.

We opened Hope Hall at 8125 S Walker that now houses our Children and Youth program, Community Living programs, Intensive Outpatient Services, Urgent Recovery Center, and Mobile Crisis Team. Our Urgent Recovery Center and Mobile Crisis teams saw 24/7 access grow to meet double the needs in 2023. In July, Hope joined forces with the Oklahoma City Fire Department and formed the Opioid Overdose Response team. This team offers medical follow up after the overdose and guides individuals toward treatment options that fit their needs. This team has made at least 400 community contacts and helped so many start their recovery journey.

URGENT RECOVERY CENTER



1,766 HOPE's URC Admissions in 2023

HOPE Urgent Recovery Center in central Oklahoma provides Crisis Intervention and evaluations for acute mental distress, substance use, and trauma-related symptoms. All **individuals are screened by a Licensed Mental Health Professional within 1 hour, regardless of payment ability.** Services aim to prevent crisis escalation, self-harm, and harm to others, with discharge planning prioritizing least restrictive care and community resources.





Age Demographics





Race Demographics




AGENCY REVENUE

Hope Community Services, Inc. recorded a substantial increase in agency revenue for the year 2023.

CO-OP PROGRAM

The Court Ordered Outpatient Program (**CO-OP**) assists justice-involved individuals with severe mental illness. This initiative provides targeted, intensive support to aid in sustaining their outpatient recovery journey. Our overarching objective is to strategically deter clients from reengaging with the judicial system, thus mitigating the occurrence of repeated incarcerations.



HOUSING PROGRAU 2704 received ongoing busing assistance

The Community Living Program has supported housing for over 270 individuals and families. Services, support and community engagement help to ensure client success. This impactful work has garnered **over \$7 million in additional funds from HUD.** We are proud to be part of a team that is making a positive impact on our community and efforts to combat homelessness.



3036 received nursing-specific services in 2023



Since becoming a Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic HOPE prioritizes comprehensive client care. Our nursing team assesses physical, mental, and psychosocial needs, crafting personalized care plans to manage chronic conditions and enhance self-care. This approach has led to significant improvements in overall health outcomes. We collaborate closely with primary care physicians and specialists to ensure seamless care coordination, underscoring our commitment to providing exceptional holistic care.

CHILDREN & YOUTH

HOPE's Children and Youth program helps children and young people overcome challenges, navigate behavioral health systems and build brighter futures. With holistic support and interventions, HOPE enables youth and their families to enjoy healthy play, improve academic performance, and flourish in life. In partnership with OKC Public School System and beyond to expand access.

In the Family Care Plan (FCP) program aims to prevent DHS involvement and reunite separated families. In 2023, 17 FCPs were initiated. Several homeless clients secured housing, and some received vital prenatal care.
